College is planning to install Solar Energy system within the college premises. It is worthwhile to mention that college has a vermi composting unit in which compostable material are recycled for production organic fertilizer. Currently this unit is one of the revenue and skill training providing unit in this particular locality. To minimize the wastage of papers as well as usage of papers, initiatives are taken to reuse the papers and preference is given on paperless work.
