#### TINSUKIA COMMERCE COLLEGE

Estd.- 1972

Over the past 53 years, Tinsukia Commerce College has evolved into a multidisciplinary institution, offering a diverse range of professional, technical, and arts programs from higher secondary to postgraduate levels. As we celebrate more than five decades of academic excellence in 2025, our institution stands as a vibrant community comprising students across Higher Secondary, Undergraduate, and Postgraduate programs in commerce and allied disciplines, along with dedicated faculty, administrative staff, parents, guardians, and Governing Body members.

The idea of establishing a commerce college in Tinsukia was conceived in 1971 by members of the Governing Body of Tinsukia College. In 1972, an Ad-hoc Committee was formed, led by Late J. N. Bhuyan as President and Late B. K. Saraswat as Secretary. The committee initiated the college under the name Tinsukia Commerce College in the 1972 academic session. Late Krishna Pada Dutta Chowdhury assumed the role of Honorary Principal, driven by a vision to provide quality commerce education in a region where no such institution existed at the time. With the generous support of Senairam H.S. School, classes were initially held in their premises. Thus, on August 21, 1972, Tinsukia Commerce College was officially established without any initial funding or infrastructure.

In 1977, the Government of Assam allocated 35 bighas of land, which remains under the college's possession. On February 1, 1986, the college was brought under the Deficit Grant-in-Aid system, and in December 2005, it became a provincialized college under the Government of Assam.

Recognizing the evolving educational needs of society, the college introduced a B.A. program in 2011-12 under Dibrugarh University on a self-financing basis. Additionally, we offer a range of courses through various universities and educational platforms, including M.B.A., M.A., M.Sc. (Mathematics), B.C.A., B.A., B.Com., and various PG diploma and certificate courses under KKHSOU, DODL-DU, and ASOS. To meet the growing demand for science education, the Government of Assam has approved the introduction of a Science stream and B.Sc. degree

courses under Dibrugarh University, which will soon be launched.

The college provides a dynamic and supportive learning environment with state-of-the-art infrastructure, including a well-equipped football ground, safe drinking water, a canteen, generator facility, a cycle stand, a library with reading and internet access, digital classrooms, computer labs, health and fitness facilities, a gym, a daycare center, a community center, an Equal Opportunity Centre, common rooms for boys and girls, sports equipment, and a pollution-free campus. In 2021, the college was also recognized as a **Khelo India Small Centre** for Football by the Directorate of Sports & Youth Welfare, Government of Assam.

To enhance skill development and industry exposure, the college has established Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with several prestigious institutions and organizations, including Skillfinity(Guwahati), ICT Academy (Chennai), K.C. Das Commerce College, Tool Room & Training Centre, Sripuria Football Academy, Bosch India Academia-Industry Partnership, Career Mentor Educare& Training Pvt. Ltd. (Maharashtra), Assam Electronics Development Corporation Ltd. (AMTRON), and Bir Raghav Moran College.

Our commitment to sustainability and green initiatives was recognized with the "One District, One Green Champion" Award (2021-22) under the Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education. Furthermore, in April 2023, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) awarded Tinsukia Commerce College an 'A' Grade with a CGPA of 3.20, reaffirming our excellence in academics, infrastructure, and overall institutional growth.

# AdmissionProcedure:

1. Eligibility Criteria for Admission in Higher Secondary 1st Year both in Arts and Commerce:

Candidates must have passed Class 10 or an Equivalent Examination from Assam State School Education Board or any other Board recognised by Assam State School Education Board (ASSEB).

2. Eligibility Criteria for Admission in Higher Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) both in Arts and Commerce:

Candidates must have passed 10 + 2 or Higher Secondary Final Year Examinationsor any other equivalent examination from ASSEB or any other Board recognised by Dibrugarh University

Theadmission process for the Higher Secondary Level shall be conducted online through the DARPAN Portal while admission to the 1st Semester FYUGP shall be conducted through SAMARTH Portal.

All admissions in HS Level and 1st Year FYUGP are provisional and subject to approval by ASSEB and Dibrugarh University respectively.

#### Continuous Evaluation Procedure

Evaluation of the students is done on a continuous basis as per the guidelines of ASSEB for HS Level and Dibrugarh University for FYUGP. The basic components of evaluation are:

#### **Higher Secondary Level:**

Any student who has pursued a regular course of study either in the H. S. 1<sup>st</sup> Year or in the 2<sup>nd</sup>Year class may be admitted to the H. S. First Year Examination or to the H. S. Final Examination in the appropriate stream as a regular candidate provided, he/she attended 75% of the classes held in each subject. A candidate, who fails to attend 75% of the classes on medical ground or for any other reasonable ground, may also be allowed to appear in the H. S. First Year Examination or H. S. Final Examination as a regular candidate as the case may be, on the basis of performance of the student in the Internal Examinations such as Unit Test/ Half Yearly Examination etc. with the permission of the ASSEB.

# Under Graduate Level (FYUGP)

College introduced Four Year Under Graduate Program (FYUGP) which is based on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as per the Regulation of Dibrugarh University.

#### Academic

BankofCredits(ABC): 'AcademicBankofCredits(ABC)' is an academic service mechanism as a digital/virtual/online entity

establishedandmanagedbyMOE/UGCtofacilitatestudentstobecomeitsacademicaccountholdersandp avingtheway of seamless student mobility, between or within degree-granting Higher EducationInstitutions (HEIs) through a formal system of credit recognition, credit accumulation, credit transfers and credit redemption to promote distributed and flexible teaching learning. Students are required to create ABC ID for the purpose of credit accumulation, credit transfers and credit redemption, etc.

#### Attendance

The course teacher shall be responsible for maintaining a record of attendance of students who have enrolled for the course.

All course teachers shall intimate the Principal/ Director of a college/ Institute through the Head of the Department concerned at least thirty calendar days prior to the last instruction day in the semester the particulars of all students who have less than 80% of attendance during the total number of class days.

A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the Endsemester examination.

Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons,

on recommendation of the Head/Chairperson/ Principals of the Department/ Centre/ College on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

The Principals of the Colleges shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to sit in the End-semester examinations in the various courses and send a copy of the same to the Controller of Examinations. Such candidates shall have to repeat the concerned course (s) when it is offered next.

A student declared as dis-collegiate shall not be allowed to proceed to the next higher Semester. He/ She shall need to pursue the Semester afresh in which he/ she was declared as dis-collegiate along with the next fresh batch.

#### **Examination and Evaluation:**

- (a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least three times during each semester.
- (b) There shall be 40% marks for internal assessment and 60% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- (c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end- semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

#### **General Information:**

# REGISTRATION:

Eligible candidates must be registered either with Assam State School Education Board or with Dibrugarh University after their admission into H.S. FirstYear or FYUGP 1<sup>st</sup> Semester. No candidate without Registration number shall be admitted to the H.S. or Degree Final Examinations.

#### SESSIONALEXAMINATION/ ASSIGNMENT:

All the candidates are continuously evaluated on the basis of Unit Test / Sessional / Assignment / Attendance / Workshop / Seminar, etc. as per the regulation of ASSEB and Dibrugarh University.

# COLLEGE IDENTITY CARD:

College Identity Cards are issued at the beginning of the session subject to replacement of the old identity cards, wherever necessary. Students must bring their Identity Cards regularly to claim any support from the authority.

#### TRANSFER CERTIFICATE:

The management does not encourage transfer of any student from the college. However, Transfer Certificate may be given to those students whose Parents/Guardians have already been formally transferred or shifted out of Tinsukia.

#### STUDENT'S CONCESSION:

Students are entitled to receive Students Railway Concession on production of Identity card on their way to home from the institution and back, during vacation only.

#### STUDENTS'S ATTENDENCE & ASSESSMENT:

The college is keen to take students class attendance strictly into account for their Promotion, Academic Awards, Character Certificates, Railway / Air Concessions, Scholarships and for calculation of Internal Assessment Score.

# STUDENTS' WELFARE FUND:
